


DP-4™ Developmental Chart

The Developmental Profile 4 (DP-4) assesses the development and functioning of children from birth through late childhood and adolescence, and provides scores up through age 21. Parents and teachers provide the information necessary to measure the child's progress across the five key areas of development: Physical, Adaptive Behavior, Social-Emotional, Cognitive, and Communication. This chart depicts just some of the behaviors parents and teachers can expect a child to master at different stages of development.
